

### 2024 Tejano Book Award Sponsored by the Tejano Genealogy Society of Austin

The Tejano Genealogy Society of Austin sponsors an annual \$2,000.00 book prize for the best non-fiction scholarly book written about Tejano history, heritage, or genealogy. This year's entries must be published between **April of the previous year and May of this year**. We request that you please submit **FOUR** copies of your eligible book entries---one each to the three **Tejano Book Award** judges' panel and one to TGSA before

the submission deadline of June 15 of this year.

#### This year's winner will receive:

- A check for \$2,000.00
- Winner will be recognized at the annual Texas State Genealogical and Historical Conference
- A paid one night's stay at the conference hotel along with two banquet tickets
- A book-signing sponsored by TGSA

# Published book entries must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Non-fiction, scholarly, and peer reviewed
- 2. Focus relates to Tejano history, genealogy, or heritage
- 3. Based on original research with full documentation, including a bibliography and footnotes or endnotes
- 4. Writing style is clear, precise, and well-organized.
- 5. Contains substantial primary sources taken from a variety of documents, images and/or interviews
- 6. Appeals to general public, genealogists or scholars
- 7. Illustrations, maps, photographs, and other visual materials supplement and relate to the topic of the book.
- 8. Dust jacket design, title, chapter layout, paper quality, and legible font/print enhance the quality and appeal of the book.
- 9. Author's thesis adds importance to the story.
- 10. Overall, the book is an enjoyable and interesting read that offers new information on the Tejano experience.
- 11. All works entered must be published in a print format.
- 12. Unpublished manuscripts and online publications will not be considered.
- 13. Entry must be the first published version of the work.
